QUALIFICATIONS

Entrance requirements vary by master's program and can be found in the [Graduate Bulletin](#).

- Apply in 3rd or 4th year, or after graduation.
- Minimum TOEFL® iBT 79; IELTS 6.5; Duolingo 110 (some majors in disciplines such as Business or Communications require higher scores).
- GPA of 3.0/4.0 (3.2/4.5 or approximately 80%).
- GRE waived for most programs, except Fox School of Business (but waivers considered).
- Completed undergraduate coursework meets most of the academic prerequisites of the graduate program.

Note: Students must maintain a 3.0 GPA while enrolled at Temple.

APPLICATION MATERIALS

- Letters of Recommendation: 1-3 letters are required, depending on master's degree program
- Resume or Curriculum Vitae
- Personal Statement
- TOEFL, IELTS, or Duolingo Score: Applicants who have not received a degree in the United States or from an approved English-language institution are required to take an approved language exam.
- Standardized Test Scores: The GRE and GMAT are waived for majors outside of the Fox School of Business. Applicants to Fox may be eligible for a waiver on a case-by-case basis. For Fox applicants not receiving a waiver, scores can be forwarded to Temple University's Graduate School (Institution Code: 2906).
- Transcripts: Official transcripts from all previous universities attended.
